Penny Ur has thirty years' experience as an English teacher in elementary, middle and high schools in Israel. Now retired, she has taught M.A. courses at Oranim Academic College of Education and Haifa University. She has presented papers at TESOL, IATEFL and various other English teachers' conferences worldwide. Her books include *Discussions that work* (1981), *Five-minute activities*, co-authored with Andrew Wright (1992), *A course in language teaching* (1996), *Grammar practice activities 2nd Edition* (2009), *Vocabulary activities* (2012), and *A course in English language teaching* (2012), *Tips for Teaching Vocabulary* (2022), all published by Cambridge University Press &

The Collaborative Grammar Classroom: Dynamic Approaches to Teaching Grammar by Rachel Jeffries
